Driving Safety Tips

SLOW DOWN

and be prepared to stop when turning or otherwise entering a crosswalk. Never pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk. There may be people crossing that you can't see.

FOLLOW THE SPEED LIMIT

especially around people on the street. Follow slower speed limits in school zones and in neighborhoods where children are present.

LOOK OUT FOR PEDESTRIANS

everywhere, at all times. Use extra caution when driving in hard-to-see conditions, such as nighttime or bad weather.

YIELD TO PEDESTRIANS

A LEGACY OF STRENGTH

Founded in 1768, the Town of Smyrna in Kent County, Delaware was originally known as Duck Creek Crossroads. There are two accounts of the origins of the name Smyrna, one being that it is named after the Greek seaport. The other suggests that the community was so moved by a sermon given by Methodist preacher Frances Ashbury about a church in the Book of Revelation, that they felt compelled to give their community the same name. In either case, the town officially became Smyrna in 1806.

Until the 1850s, the community was a prosperous port, shipping goods along Duck Creek. Smyrna continued as a center of agriculture through the 19th century, and today is home to 12,000 people – and a bevy of rapidly growing residential and industrial opportunities.
